Returning To The Church Near You!

As you know last year we introduced our first "Narrative Budget" to better reflect how our resources are allocated to the ministries we provide with a focus on how they fulfill our mission. We then used this Narrative Budget as our guide in a four week mission focused stewardship program.

Each week we highlighted one of our four mission areas: Worship, Faith Development, Mission & Service and Fellowship & Hospitality.

We were very pleased with the many positive comments we received about this new mission focused approach to stewardship and budgeting. As a result we saw increases in both the number of pledges received (up 10%) and the amount pledged (up 12%) for 2017.

This year, we will again be focusing on these mission areas during a four week Stewardship emphasis. Each week we will highlight one area of our Mission and provide the opportunity for you to complete a commitment card for 2018. We are hopeful that in this way we will be able to increase the number of members that make an advance commitment. This is important to your council for planning our ability to expand our ministries in 2018. We hope you will plan to be with us in church each Sunday to learn more.



Adults and children will be studying the same verses each week, discovering how to weave faith into your life and walk with God for a lifetime.

The series this fall focuses on a study of Genesis.

All God's Creatures

Many congregations hold a "Blessing of the Animals" service on or around October 4th, the commemoration of Francis of Assisi (1182 - 1226). St. Francis was known for his care of the poor, his simplicity of life and his love of nature. Francis exemplified a spirit of honor, love and respect for all living things. When people are asked what blessing they receive from their pets, they often name such things as "unconditional love, companionship, protection, meeting their need to be needed, motivation to walk daily, playfulness and contentment". Others describe how caring for pets has helped their children learn to become more responsible, patient and compassionate. Animals are a blessing, both in what they provide to us and in their value as beloved members of God's creation. (Psalm 104) In blessing the animals, we affirm our connection with one another and with all of God's beloved creation. With blessing lies promise, commitment and inspiration to care for what belongs to God, to live together in peace and harmony and to be good stewards of all that God has made!

The Apostles' Creed

Session Two: I believe in Jesus Christ by Julia Seymour

Focus Verse: "But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name" (John 20:31).

This month's study is all about Jesus. Believing in Jesus as our Lord and Savior is the defining truth of Christianity, and yet he is so often the central figure in our disagreements. The central theme of the Second Article of the Apostles' Creed is to clarify what we believe about Jesus. Beyond Jesus' teaching, miracles and ministry, the Creed speaks to the fundamentals of Christology - the study of Christ.

We Must Keep Talking about RACISM!

Our ELCA Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton said about the Charlottesville, VA violence, "We need to stand up firmly against racism and anti-Semitism, show up for and advocate with others!" We are all encouraged to download the ELCA's social statement on Race, Ethnicity and Culture. The statement was created and adopted in 1993. The statement calls "*Racism – a mix of power, privilege, and* prejudice – is sin, a violation of God's intention for humanity." It goes on to say hat "our mission and ministry are in a society where white people have been favored and hold unequal power to implement their prejudices – socially, politically, and economically. What has been the case is STILL the case: skin color makes a difference and white people benefit from a privileged position." The statement outlines expectations it has of church leadership ranging from naming the sin of racism and leading the church in repentance to continuing to challenge the church to be in mission and ministry in a multicultural society. The church's pursuit of justice involves: 1) resisting cynicism; 2) refusing to blame victimized people for their situations; 3) assuring the participation of all people; and 4) addressing the relationship between racism and social issues such as immigration, crime, and environmental pollution and how economic forces work against people of color in housing, medical care, education, and employment. The church commits to involvement at all levels of public life, "globally and locally, nationally and in neighborhoods." Resolve, Repentance and Commitment.

It never ceases to amaze me how quickly the seasons of our lives pass by. It seems like just a few days ago, I was crafting one of these little articles in thankfulness to share what I would be doing throughout the summer while on sabbatical. Now as I write, all those treasured experiences are in the rearview and I am struck with continued gratitude as I discover new insights and refreshment from all that I was blessed to see and do.

Throughout my life I've always been drawn to the idea and reality of seasons. It's one reason among many that I appreciate living in the north. As the world changes around us, the rhythm of the seasons gives us the opportunity to take pause at least every few months to examine what God might be doing within and around us. The seasons also instruct us that in our lives there are times of planting and times of harvest, day and night, hot and cold, times when fruit is plentiful, and wintery times when dormant inactivity is exactly what we need.

The Fall is one of those interesting seasons in which our lives are often lived at odds with what the season is telling us. Around us, the leaves are beginning to change and die off, the insects stop chirping at night, summer birds become more and more rare, and the grass in our lawns doesn't cry out to be cut so often anymore. Nature is slowing down. But as nature begins to slow, our lives often speed up. The activity of the fall months often brings our lives to a new and frantic pace as we enter into new experiences and try to keep up with old ones.

The month of October is a busy one for sure, but it's also a month that offers some opportunities to take a breath and listen to how God might be at work in our lives and in the world during this season. You likely know that this month brings the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation; an event that has profoundly affected our world and our faith. As our attention is drawn to that moment through Bible Studies, the Oktoberfest celebration, and Reformation Sunday, we might let our hearts and minds be drawn to imagine what might need reforming in our own lives of faith. What in our church or community could use a change? What in our understanding of God or our neighbor could benefit from reform?

October also brings us to a focus on Stewardship, which *is* about money, but is not *only* about money. Through our narrative view of the budget, we are encouraged to examine our lives of faith through the lenses of Fellowship and Hospitality, Worship, Faith Development, and Mission and Service. As we think about our financial giving, might we also pause and think about our lives and where we are drawn to serve, rest, and experience God?

Whether it's soccer practice, a return to 60 hour work weeks, marching band rehearsals, committee meetings, teaching, studying, projects at home, or just the brutal pace of the news cycle, it seems that life is moving at a more frenetic pace than we're made to handle. May we all take a cue from nature and allow some of the leaves of our lives to fall. As nature slows around us may we take pause to give thanks to God for the many seasons in our lives, asking God what he might be doing among us and what new things this season may bring.
