News from the SCRIP Table and the SWELL Partnership*

WELCA Mission Action

Our June Harding's reward check for \$10.84 has been deposited in the bank. We invite other Harding's shoppers from Trinity to join this program - just ask for information at the SCRIP table.

The Backpacks for Foster Kids project was recently completed thanks to many volunteers and a ton of members and friends of Trinity who donated 64 backpacks! Our Thrivent Action Team money (\$250) was used for supplies; many were also donated. Profits from our SCRIP sales paid for the rest. This is a huge annual project and greatly appreciated by Samaritas. A stream of their staff came out to lug 143 filled backpacks into their conference room in no time flat.

We hope to match all or part of the profits from the Rummage Sale through SCRIP sales. This will enable our pastors to again assist needy people in our community since Trinity's Good Samaritan fund is currently depleted.

As always, thank you for helping us help others!

*<u>Sharing With Everyone Lutheran Love</u> is a partnership between Samaritas and volunteers from area ELCA Churches supporting the Samaritas program for foster children. The Community Healing Centers is our project for September. They strive to strengthen our communities by helping adults, children and families heal from the trauma of abuse, addiction, mental and behavioral health disorders and through effective prevention services.

Some of the items that are needed include new or gently used board books, baby wipes including "sensitive", diapers sizes 1-6, new or gently used baby and young children's clothing, infant blankets burp clothes and bibs, baby soap and lotion, diaper cream, formula, cheerios and art supplies. Kairos received \$21.90 worth of supplies in July and the YWCA Domestic Assault Program received \$81.00 of personal care items. Thank you for your generosity.

Returning To The Church Near You!

As you know last year we introduced our first "Narrative Budget" to better reflect how our resources are allocated to the ministries we provide with a focus on how they fulfill our mission. We then used this Narrative Budget as our guide in a four week mission focused stewardship program.

Each week we highlighted one of our four mission areas: Worship, Faith Development, Mission & Service and Fellowship & Hospitality.

We were very pleased with the many positive comments we received about this new mission focused approach to stewardship and budgeting. As a result we saw increases in both the number of pledges received (up 10%) and the amount pledged (up 12%) for 2017.

This year, we will again be focusing on these mission areas during a four week Stewardship emphasis. Each week we will highlight one area of our Mission and provide the opportunity for you to complete a commitment card for 2018. We are hopeful that in this way we will be able to increase the number of members that make an advance commitment. This is important to your council for planning our ability to expand our ministries in 2018. We hope you will plan to be with us in church each Sunday to learn more.

Micah

I've been dwelling quite a bit lately on the prophet Micah. 27 centuries after his death, Micah's words still live. Islam, Christianity and Judaism all recognize Micah as a prophet and the words in Micah 6:8 ring true for all three religions: *"He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord <u>require</u> of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?" Through Micah, God promises freedom and hope for those who suffer from injustice and oppression, and He promises that the world in which the poor and outcast are lifted up is a world that gives <u>life and hope</u> to all of us. As the oppressed are freed, so are the oppressors: freed from greed, fear and sin. May we keep living and moving until the day when Micah's promise defines us and our world.*

The Apostles' Creed Session One: We believe in God by Julia Seymour

The Apostles' Creed was developed as a teaching tool for faith. Besides teaching the elements of faith, it was also a way to standardize the faith. Making sure that all Christians learned and publicly professed the same things about God – Father, Son and Holy Spirit – was an attempt to prevent heresy in teaching and in belief. Luther consistently pushes through the affirmation of who God is to the affirmation of who God is for me. All too often, when we talk about God as Creator, we get bogged down in unanswerable questions about what happened "in the beginning". But for Luther, to confess God as creator is a statement about here and now. Luther, in his Small Catechism, states "I believe that God has created me and all that exists; that God has given me and still sustains my body and soul, all my limbs and senses, my reason and all the faculties of my mind, together with food and clothing, house and home, family and property." Luther grasped that the life of faith is not about answers; it's about **relationship**. Faith is not religious knowledge. Faith is trust – trust that God is for me, for you, for us. When we recite Martin Luther's words, "This is most certainly true," it's not because we have God or our faith all figured out. It's more like a prayer: Lord, I believe; help my unbelief!





Also, the shipping cost has gone up to \$9. The official shoeboxes are available here at Trinity along with the packing labels and brochure.

VINE NEIGHBORHOOD HOME PAINTING PROJECT IN SEPTEMBER 2017

Hopes are high for a renewal of our Vine Neighborhood Home Painting Project! And, come this September, we will likely need LOTS of volunteers to help with equipment, food and water and all the support tasks, as well as with the painting itself. Tentatively we are scheduled for September 23 and 30.

We have a homeowner in need: a delightful 70+ year-old single woman, very eager to somehow paint her home and better contribute to the renewal of her area of Oak Street in the neighborhood. The Vine Neighborhood Association has requested our assistance along with First Presbyterian Church and First Congregational Churches in securing support, both of money and volunteer labor, for the project. We have high hopes that the success of our last project will encourage all 3 of us to come back together for the Project this year.

And, not least, we have a professional painter ready to scrape, wash, and caulk the house in preparation for our own work—that of applying the primer and finish coats of paint.

So, stay tuned! In very early September, we will be reaching out. And this should be fun. Our homeowner is an interesting and generous person; our church partners are wonderful people, and the Vine Neighborhood, powered by multi-agency collaboration and active resident groups on individual streets, is an unusually positive area for us to support. We already have a list of eager volunteers from our last project, but whatever your level of physical ability, we need you too! We have had a "Good Samaritan Fund" for many years at Trinity. It helps with Utility shut off notices, evictions, and emergencies of all types. Thousands of dollars are given out on an annual basis. This fund is supported by giving not included in our normal operating budget. This year the need has been greater than in recent memory, and we have run out of funds several times.

The rummage sale is always a wonderful infusion of funds into this ministry. Thank you so much to the many people who donate goods and time volunteering for this exhaustive effort!

We have recently been fielding sometimes a dozen calls a day for assistance. With other churches and agencies we are able to help in a lot of critical situations, but the couple thousand dollars raised by the rummage sale will probably only last a few months before that is depleted.

Please prayerfully consider, if the opportunity arises, to give to this wonderful ministry to those less fortunate in our midst. May we be a blessing to others as Christ has been a blessing to us!
