From our Director of Music

Dear Christian Friends,

The Second Book of Chronicles (20: 1-30) contains the story of the Jehoshaphat, the righteous King of Judah, and how he countered an attacking army with his own army led by a Choir, singing, "Praise the Lord; for his mercy endures forever." The choir led the army! Verse 22 tells us that the army of Moab, Ammon, and Mount Seir was routed by Judah's army led by the choir.

This is one of many scriptural accounts of God accomplishing extraordinary things through ordinary people. I strongly believe that Trinity's choir is one of God's tools, ordinary people doing the extraordinary, proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ in song. I often say that our choir is comprised, not of professional musicians, but of "butchers and bakers and candlestick-makers." We can't know the degree to which the Holy Spirit uses our choir to grow the Gospel in the hearts of his people sitting in the pews at Trinity Church. I believe that, through the Power of the Holy Spirit, we are doing the extraordinary!

We are starting something new this year. Thursday evening choir rehearsals will be eliminated. Beginning on Sunday, September 11, we will hold the weekly choir rehearsal on Sunday mornings at 9:30, immediately after the early service, in the organ loft - NOT in the choir room. We will then sing at the 11:00 a.m. service. We can use YOU! GOD can use you! Trinity Clothes Closet

The Clothes Closet is open every Tuesday from 10-2 and has been serving our neighbors in need successfully throughout the pandemic. They continue to accept all donations of gently used clothing and are looking especially for winter gear—coats, boot, hats, gloves etc. for a Winter Gear Giveaway in November.

Food Pantry Update

Following the Covid closing and then the construction project, we have been in the process of determining the best timing and organization for Trinity's food pantry.

There have been many changes at Loaves and Fishes as well as at Trinity. They are offering home delivery of food as well as order pick up. Only a couple sites offer the grocery option that we have used in the past. Following L&F guidelines, we assemble orders and meet clients at our new entrance for loading food into cars.

These changes, as well as our closing, have resulted in a very slow start to our reopening. The L&F staff has assured us that we are still needed to distribute food so that all needs are met.

We are now open on Tuesdays from 11-1 to coincide with the hours of the Clothes Closet. Some clients are sent from Loaves and Fishes and some come to us while they are here for clothing.

As of mid-August, our numbers are slowly increasing. If this trend continues, we hope that we can call on the volunteers who have offered to help.

Sales have diminished but continue to bring in funds for our Service Team activities. Please keep our gift cards in mind for eating out, home improvement, gas and the many occasions where you need a gift. If you have a Kohl's charge card, you can earn 4% for Trinity by paying your bill with Kohl's from the SCRIP table. When your bill comes, just stop at the SCRIP table to buy what you wish to pay (or more!) and a chore becomes a win-win. (Kohl's cards come in \$25's and \$100.) Downside: you do have to go into the store, but you can pay at any register.

Another option is to have a personal RaiseRight account so you can order e-cards online and receive them immediately. (There is a \$.15 fee if you use your bank account.) Trinity still receives the retailer rebate.



During the height of uncertainty in the Covid pandemic, we closed down, masked up, and socially distanced. As weeks turned into months and then years, we struggled as a church to find an



appropriate safe balance for gathering. We still contend with a variety of capricious shifts and turns. Is a person comfortable with me approaching them before or after church if I am or am not wearing a mask? Should I shake hands, fist bump, or wave? Should one shout or raise a voice and keep social distance?

As the pandemic lingers, a vitally important question lingers often unanswered. How can we continue to proactively show hospitality, and "welcome" the stranger into our midst? Trinity had been known for a very friendly and welcoming atmosphere. Often gregarious outreach to a stranger was the norm.

We are trying to get volunteers to once again be greeters and ushers. To be at the doors and gathering spaces to greet and provide direction to worship or activities. Might you prayerfully consider helping us restart these endeavors?

Critical in our readjustment back to a welcoming space and place, is that everyone make the effort to let mutual love show. Seek out the stranger, do not worry of embarrassment of greeting a long time member! We actually have a reason over the last couple years of forgetting faces and names due to closing and online worship. Consider this an opportunity to reconnect as a gathering of disciples which is focused on Word and Sacrament, outward mission. Let us joyfully show and experience the mutual love of Christ and entertain angels in our midst!
