"There was a rich man who lived in luxury. At his gate lay a poor man named Lazarus. The time came when the poor man died, and the angels carried him to be with Abraham." LK 16:19-22

The last Sunday in September had this Gospel lesson from Luke 16. As we approach (or have already celebrated) the "holidays"/Holy



Days of late October thru December, I'm hoping and praying that we as a community can show extravagant hospitality. May we be intentional about inviting others. Over 1,600 years ago one of the Church Fathers, St. John Chrysostom wrote about this text.

"It is worthwhile enquiring why the rich man saw Lazarus in Abraham's arms, and not in the company of some other righteous person. The reason is that Abraham was hospitable, and so the sight of Lazarus with Abraham was meant to reproach the rich man for his own inhospitality. Abraham used to pursue even passers-by and drag them into his home, whereas the rich man disregarded someone lying in his own doorway. He could have helped him but failed to do so. Abraham was not like that but the opposite. He would sit in his doorway and catch all who passed by. And just as a fisherman casting a net into the sea hauls up fish, yes, but also quite often gold and pearls, so Abraham whilst catching people in his net finished by catching angels, strangely enough without knowing it. (Gen.18, Heb. 13)

At least 3 Sundays in August and September, we literally had the poor laying at our front church doors. I usually arrive at 7am on Sunday mornings, and have seen the stranger(s) sleeping in the doorway of Westnedge. Twice invited them in for coffee and food, and they came, the other time had to call the police/ambulance. Our church has always been a refuge for the poor. We can provide food, clothing, a temporary shelter, a listening ear, a sense of dignity as a child of God.

Can we also emulate Abraham, and "catch all who pass by". Inviting people to church, engaging in conversation, reaching out to those we might not know, are all hallmarks of a welcoming and loving parish. Especially with the addition of online services, the possibility of "come and see" (or go and watch :) is expanded. Prayerfully consider who you might invite, or a "stranger" at church that you might engage in conversation. As we approach a new liturgical church year, may we once again strive to be as welcoming and hospitable as possible in the name of Christ!

May the peace of Christ, which passes all understanding, be with us all, Pr. Ken

Theological Educational Opportunity! Beginning in winter 2023, our Synod (*the North/West Lower Michigan Synod*) of the ELCA will offer a series six-week Zoom courses led by seminary professors. These courses are open to all adults, both laypeople and rostered ministers, and are free of charge!

The first course offering will be "Corinthian Correspondence: Conflict, Case Studies, Contemporary Congregalons, and Christ" led by Rev. Dr. Walter F. Taylor, Jr., the Ernest W. and Edith S. Ogram Professor Emeritus of New Testament Studies, Trinity Lutheran Seminary at Capital University. As an added draw, Dr. Taylor was Pr. Jake's faculty advisor (and favorite professor!) while at seminary and has visited Trinity to preach and teach on a number of occasions!

The goal of this study is to learn from Paul and his house churches in the ancient Greek city of Corinth— both how they fell into conflict and how Paul sought to move them to reconciliation and ministry; and how that history relates to problems facing believers and the church today. The class will meet online via Zoom on six consecutive Tuesday evenings: January 10, 17, 24, 31; February 7, 14, 2023 from 7:00 – 8:15pm ET. Registration will close December 1, 2022.

As you see new people in the pews, or during Fellowship time, etc., here are some simple things to do: make solid eye contact and smile; if close enough, introduce yourself. Here is an easy intro to consider using: "Hi! I'm (your name). I am glad you are with us this morning." Give them time to share their name. If you are unsure if they are visitors or already members, here is another way to introduce yourself: "Hello. We may have met before, but my name is (your name). Welcome today." Again, let them share their name and if a visitor or member.

Please don't use "Sharing of the Peace" as a time of lengthy conversations/introductions; save it for later!

One last tidbit: "Try it, you'll like it!"
