*Donate non-perishable food to Trinity's food pantry. Since Loaves and Fishes supplies their clients with basic food, we would like to provide our customers (who are often our local neighbors and frequently are homeless or have limited food preparation facilities) with items they like and find special. Please note that all items received will be handed out over and above the standard Loaves and Fishes order. Types of items that fit this need may include:

- juice boxes, cereal (store brand is great), cookies (boxes or bags, tooth brushes, Jiffy (or other) cake or muffin mix, canned frosting, power bars (good item for homeless), packs of cheese or peanut butter crackers, boxed crackers of any kind, fruit cups, small bottles of water.

* Give a monetary donation to support our Good Samaritan Fund, which is critical in supporting our local community members that has occasionally struggled with utility bills and shut-offs or rent and evictions.



"Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever" Hebrews 13:8



The season of Fall can be punctuated by both poignancy as well as anticipation. Poignancy as we commemorate All Saints, the leaves color and scatter, and the earth itself prepares to "sleep" for a season. Anticipation as Halloween (especially for children), Thanksgiving and Christmas draw near.

Family gatherings and festive times are being planned by many.

November also encompasses the ending of the church year on the 26th, Christ the King Sunday. Often the readings closing out the church year are of end times and preparation for the return of the second coming of Christ. Once again one can have a sense of both longing and reckoning. Perhaps especially this year we ponder the verses from Matthew 24:6,7 about "wars and rumors of wars", of "nation rising against nation", famines, earthquakes, the brokenness of humanity.

Yet as the days become shorter and the darkness lengthens, we hold fast to sure certainties and promises. The light of Jesus Christ shines brightly in the midst of a struggling world.
