Quilters - Helping Hands Needed!! To sew or not to sew??? Often folks who would like to volunteer for the Quilters group are concerned that they need to know how to sew. Far from it! We meet on the morning of the fourth and fifth Thursdays of the month, January through October (including a break for coffee and a nosh!) to assemble quilts for Lutheran World Relief. We need people to lay out a 6 by 8 pattern of precut squares (no sewing!) (volunteers who sew will take these home to sew into tops.) The next job is to pin all the edges of the "sandwich" (a bottom, a layer of batting and a top) (again, no sewing!). This is then passed to a table where the layers are tied together using a needle and yarn. (no sewing!) Finally, the quilt goes to one of the sewing machines for finishing. Some of our regular crew have moved away and some can no longer help due to poor health. Cultivating a Community Connection between Trinity and El Sol Elementary

Megan Floyd | Internship Project 2023-2024

Pastoral interns in the ELCA traditionally engage in a special project for their internship site. After getting to know you these last few months and listening to the leadership here,

I've designed my project to focus on nurturing and growing the relationship between Trinity and EL Sol Elementary. I'm excited to share this proposal with the broader congregation! I invite you to ask me questions about this and to jump into wherever you think you feel called to participate.

<u>Cultivating a Community Connection</u>: Relationships are more than grand gestures and one-off events. Whether between people or organizations, a true relationship requires a continual nurturing of the connection.

This project will, therefore, focus on opportunities, both small and large, for Trinity Lutheran Church to build a connection with El Sol Elementary as a trusted resource and good neighbor.

- I. Holiday Food Support for Thanksgiving [COMPLETED]
 - a. Provide El Sol with (10) \$50 gift cards to Meijer [big box grocery store] for families with the highest need, as identified by Dr. Wilson, principal, and Ms. Perla, CIS Coordinator. The cards were delivered on Nov. 17, along with an invitation to Trinity's other assistance opportunities [food pantry and free clothes closet] and our regular worship services.
- II. School Supply Needs
 - a. Dr. Wilson and Ms. Perla identified an ongoing need for backpacks, crayons, standard washable markers, and plastic two-pocket folders. **(Date ongoing)**
 - i. We will set up a collection point in the church and advertise this need. Donations will be gathered and brought to the school once a month.
- III. Clothing Connection with Trinity's Christ Clothes Closet
 - a. El Sol's kids need winter clothes and gear, per Dr. Wilson and Ms. Perla.
 - i. Hold a Clothing Drive for kid's clothes, socks, underwear, and winter gear in all kid sizes. Church members are asked to share this need in their wider circles so we can begin stockpiling clothes in advance of the January event date.
 - A special Friday evening of "shopping," pizza, and games for El Sol families, complete with Spanish language translators. This evening will be held on a Friday after school because the school has existing after-school programming and dinner on Mon-Thur. [Friday, January 12, 2024]
 - Ms. Perla requested that we have two sessions on Jan 12; a morning session from 10AM – Noon, and a later session from 4PM – 7PM. The pizza and games will only be offered at the later session.
- IV. Bicycles for Literacy Night Raffle
 - a. <u>Step one</u>... hold a bike drive within the congregation and invite members to reach out to their neighbors and places of employment to participate. New bikes are wonderful, but we are also seeking used bikes that may or may not need repairs and tune-ups. The bikes will be repaired and tuned up and donated to El Sol to raffle off at their Literacy Night in March.

- b. <u>Step two</u>... Fix-a-palooza Workshop at the Open Roads Bike Program shop on Jan 27, 2024, from 11 AM 3 PM: 6-7 Volunteers (adults and/or high school youth) from Trinity spend 3-4 hours at the Open Roads shop learning how to fix the bikes that were donated. This is an opportunity to both learn bicycle repair and maintenance and help get the bikes in shape for El Sol. We'll provide lunch. *If we have more than 7 volunteers who want to participate in the Fix-a-palooza workshop, we can schedule a second date.*
 - i. The cost for this workshop will be \$250 for the Open Roads staff and likely not more than \$250 for additional parts needed for the repairs. (\$500 total) We can use a Thrivent grant for the parts.
- c. <u>Step three</u>... deliver the collected and repaired bikes to El Sol in time for Literacy Night in March 2024.
 - i. Locate a source for helmets and bike locks before March so the raffle winners will be able to ride their new bikes around safely and securely.
- V. Further possibilities...
 - a. End-of-School Carnival at Trinity with a parade of bikes, and maybe more bikes to raffle if we experience an abundance of donations and people getting training in bike repair. Invite Open Roads to be part of the event.
 - b. Hold a fundraiser event to raise \$2,000 to sponsor the Open Roads *Earn-a-Bike Program* at El Sol. This program combines the practical skills of bike maintenance and repair with social-emotional learning.
 - i. This is likely a project where the fundraising might happen while I'm still at Trinity, but the programming between El Sol and Open Roads would be for the 2024-2025 school year.
 - ii. Ms. Perla at El Sol is very interested in this and in establishing a relationship with Open Roads as a possible organization for other events at El Sol. I've connected her to Open Roads leadership so they can begin that connection process.

A bit about the Open Roads Bike Program...

Open Roads is, at its core, a non-profit youth development program funded by grants. At the simplest level, any child is welcome to come to the shop with their bike during open shop hours (Thursdays & Fridays), and they will teach that child how to fix their bike – no charge for the labor or the parts. They also help parents teach their children how to ride a bike, including bike safety and road rules.

*Adults are also welcome to come in for help with their repairs, but they ask adults to pay for the parts used for repairs.

On a deeper level, interested youth can become apprentice bicycle mechanics starting at age 14. As they grow and learn, they move from learning with a trainer who diagnoses the repairs and teaches them how to fix the bike to be able to diagnose and repair it for themselves. Youth who continue to be interested can be hired on as teaching staff who both fix bikes that come into the shop and go into the field to teach others with the guidance of the Open Roads senior staff. Field opportunities include community events and the Earn-a-Bike program held at schools and other youth organizations.

Beyond that, Open Roads has a Youth Advisory Board – a group of youth who have shown aptitude for leadership who then serve on the board of this organization and engage in further leadership development opportunities.

Opportunities to participate in building this Community Connection

I. <u>School Supply Needs</u>

- a. Are any artists out there interested in decorating a box for this collection?
- b. Donate backpacks, crayons, standard washable markers, and plastic two-pocket folders easy to pick up a few items each time you shop... it adds up over time!

II. <u>Clothing Connection with Trinity's Christ Clothes Closet</u>

- a. Reach out to your friends and neighbors to share the need for donated clothes and winter gear.
- b. Volunteer with the clothes crew to help sort the (hopefully abundant) donations.
- c. Volunteer for either the morning **[10 AM Noon]** or later **[4 PM 7 PM]** shopping session on **Jan 12, 2024**.
 - i. Spanish speakers are especially needed (bilingual staff from El Sol are also planning to attend).
 - ii. We are looking for people who can help set up the pizza dinner and people to play simple games with the kids while the parents shop during the later session. *Teenagers are also welcome to volunteer!*
 - iii. Do you have simple games where language isn't a barrier? Can we borrow them?
- d. <u>Thrivent Members seeking two</u>! We could use a grant to provide dinner at the later session. We could use another grant to purchase new socks and underwear for the kids.

III. Bicycles for Literacy Night Raffle

- a. Bike drive! Do you have any bicycles to donate? Can you help us share this need with your connections beyond Trinity?
- b. Be part of the Fix-a-palooza Workshop on Jan 27, 2024, from 11 AM 3 PM: We are seeking 6-7 Volunteers (adults and/or high school youth) who are interested in repairing the donated bikes under the guidance of the Open Roads staff.
 - i. If we have more than 7 volunteers who want to participate in the Fix-a-palooza workshop, we can schedule a second date.
- c. <u>Thrivent Members seeking two</u>! We can use one Thrivent Grant card to pay for the parts we need for the repairs. We can use another grant card to purchase new helmets and bike locks.
