Quilters - Helping Hands Needed!! To sew or not to sew??? Often folks who would like to volunteer for the Quilters group are concerned that they need to know how to sew. Far from it! We meet on the morning of the fourth and fifth Thursdays of the month, January through October (including a break for coffee and a nosh!) to assemble quilts for Lutheran World Relief. We need people to lay out a 6 by 8 pattern of precut squares (no sewing!) (volunteers who sew will take these home to sew into tops.) The next job is to pin all the edges of the "sandwich" (a bottom, a layer of batting and a top) (again, no sewing!). This is then passed to a table where the layers are tied together using a needle and yarn. (no sewing!) Finally, the quilt goes to one of the sewing machines for finishing. Some of our regular crew have moved away and some can no longer help due to poor health.
