Sunday Morning Adult Lenten Bible Study - "We Make the Road by Walking" by Brian McLaren McLaren is a pastor, teacher, and contemplative who seeks to help us engage with the Bible in a way that opens us to new ways of understanding God's story of Redemption. Join us in the lounge Sundays February 18- March 31 from 9:45-10:35.

Back to the Hymnals! Did you know...at Trinity we print roughly 200 bulletins each week using an average of five full pages of paper in each bulletin. This means that we use 1000 sheets of paper each week and approximately 52,000 sheets per year...just for the Sunday morning bulletin! We began printing the hymns in the bulletin in order to reduce the risk of COVID transmission during the height of the pandemic. Certainly, many of us have gotten used to the ease of having all parts of the service printed and ready to go, but by moving forward from the pandemic and making use of the hymnals, we can reduce our paper usage by around 20%. That's 10,400 sheets of paper every year saved...(Not to mention the expense and wear and tear on the copier)!

So, to be better stewards of creation and the many gifts that we've been given, beginning in May, we will stop printing the hymns in the bulletin and will go back to using the red ELW Hymnals that are in every pew. If you need the hymns printed out for you for any reason, we will have a few large print copies available each week. Also, if you borrowed a hymnal from the sanctuary at any point during the pandemic, please return that to the church. Thank you!

Men's Bible Study meets throughout the year, every other week on Wednesday mornings at 7am in the church Fellowship Hall! March dates are April 3 and April 17. All are welcome to join them for breakfast and bible study.



It's hard to believe that it has been nearly fourteen years since I was called to serve at Trinity. During those years I have truly been blessed to experience life and *life abundantly* as Jesus promises! That abundant life has come in so many ways as relationships have

grown, ministry has been done, and life experiences have been shared. I am truly grateful for this community of which I am blessed to be a part.

I am also incredibly grateful that this congregation is one that understands the demands of pastoral life and has developed a policy and practice designed to grant a time of renewal to those who are called to serve. It is the policy of Trinity to grant a sabbatical to their called pastors every seven years, and this time is a true gift that enables us as leaders to step away from the everyday demands of ministry in order to refresh and renew in spirit, faith, and perspective as well as reconnect with our families.

Beginning in late April, I will begin a time of sabbatical that will continue until the end of August. Last year I applied for (and was thrilled to receive!) a Clergy Renewal Grant from the Lilly Foundation. This grant will cover all funding needs for all sabbatical activities for myself and my family as well as renewal activities for the congregation while I am away. I won't go into the complete schedule while I'm away, you'll hear all about that when I come back, but in summary, my renewal activities will include a silent monastic retreat in California (for me), an Immersive tour of eastern religions in Japan (for Melissa and I), and a prolonged stay in the UK and Ireland (for my family) where we will experience the gift of staying at the Isle of Iona before going on to visit many other historic and holy sites.

During my time away, the congregation will of course continue to be in the very capable hands of Pr. Ken and Vicar Megan. In addition, you will benefit from the expertise of two theologians in residence as Dr. Amy Allen and Dr. Tim McNinch will each be spending a week with the congregation in June to share their expertise and insights and a special guest will be brought in August for a focused time of retreat with the women of the church (more to come on all of that!). My hope is that just as this is a time of renewal and learning for me, it will be the same for our family of Trinity!

Again, I want to express my deep and sincere thanks to this congregation for all of the support that you show us as your pastors, but especially for this time of renewal. Often when I get dressed for church, my son George will ask me, "You're not a pastor, your my dad right?". I tell him that I am both, but along with the study, renewal, and exploration that this Sabbatical will bring, I am very much looking forward to some time to be a dad. So thank you for the opportunity to step away to dig deeper into this abundant life that we have been given in Christ.
